## Teacher Attrition Rates: Why are the numbers so high?

- Unprepared for the administrative responsibilities.
- · Perceived lack of support from superiors.
- Isolation; reluctance to seek help for fear of exposing inexperience
- Parents
- Unprepared for the transition from being the student to being the teacher.

## What can be done?

- Teacher "induction" as opposed to orientation.
- Mentor teachers.

### Four areas to address

Information

We never stop teaching the instruments Your "GO TO" list Conventions, symposia, MEAs

Experience

Too little too late
Field experience (long term)
Do whatever it takes to get experience, even if you donate your time.
Cultivate relationships with successful teachers
Observe teachers in challenging situations

Structure

Get the administrative tasks out of the way first (delayed gratification) Plan for YOUR class, the one you'll actually teach Share/assign/delegate

Relationships

With administrators With the "Four Cs" With students With parents

The reason we're teachers hasn't changed even if our circumstances have!

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
